첨부자료는 호주서부지방의 한 농가가 관개수로 사용하는 물이 염분농도(Sodium)가 1,590ppm 으로 아주 높아 과수와 정원수가 자라지 못하고 말라죽는데 Turbu-Flow를 설치한 후 살아나서 밝은 녹색을 띤 정상적인 상태로 자라게된 것을 설명하고 있습니다.

G'day Earl,
Here are the pictures I took whilst installing the water softeners on my bore and out of my bore water holding tank.

The bore water that we are currently using is for irrigating our native garden (approx 60 plants) and our 18 fruit trees (all of which are about 15 months to 2 years old), we have put some watermelon seedlings at the base of a couple of the fruit trees and they are growing well, which I think is an indication that they are handling the water with no problems.

I went and took some photos around home the other day, and got some photos from the same time that we installed Turbu-Flow, as you can see the gardens are going well, especially the native.

In the beginning I think we were over watering the native garden, about every second day, it looked like it was browning off a bit so we cut back the watering times to about once or twice a week, and it picked up and hasn't looked back, we have had the occasional plant die but am sure that it's not related to the water.

I have sprayed the area I am planning on putting lawn onto so hopefully can get that set up before spring. I am planning on putting Kikuyu as it is quite hardy and should do well with the water. I will send some progress photos as it develops.
